

Level 1: Worship and Character

Course Description:

Allah the Most High, through his infinite mercy and wisdom has made the deen of Islam easy to learn and understand. This great blessing of Allah, can be appreciated by the student having a thorough understanding of the Pillars of Islam and the Pillars of Iman. It is important that the student recognize the primary difference between these sets of pillars: The Pillars of Islam focus on the apparent actions of a Muslim, i.e. his or her apparent deeds, while the Pillars of Imaan focus on the beliefs of a Muslim. In this subject, the student begins the study of the Pillars of Islam by being introduced to the topics of Wudoo', Salat, and Fasting. Additionally, the student will be introduced:

- The 5 Pillars of Islam
- Wudoo' and Salat

Furthermore, the student will be introduced to some of the important characteristics of a Muslim, such as: cleanliness, obedience to parents, and caring for others.

Be inspired to practice the five pillars of Islam. Know the following vocabulary terms: Arkan-ul-Islam, Salah, Sawm, Ramadan, Hajj, Shahadah, Al-Ka'bah, Siyam, Zakah 		
Chapter 2: I Love Salah, Prayer	 Name the five daily prayers and their times. Appreciate the importance of prayer. Learn the hadeeth that Allah loves when we pray on time. Know the following terms: Fajr, Thuhr, Asr, Maghrib, Isha. 		
Chapter 3: Wudoo' Makes Me Clean	 Define wudoo'. Demonstrate the process of wudoo' from niyyah to shahadah. State the things that break your wudoo'. Know the du'aa' for entering and leaving the bathroom. Know what should be said after completing your wudoo'. Understand the reward for making wudoo' perfectly and then reciting the shahadah. 		
Chapter 3.5: Practicing Wudoo'	 Demonstrate to your teacher how to make wudoo'. The students will be taken to the bathroom by volunteers and will be instructed on how to make wudoo'. 		
Chapter 4: Zaid Learns How To Pray	 Know all the steps of praying one Rak'ah. Know where we face when we pray. Know the number of rakats per prayer. Know what should be said in each step of prayer. Learn the Tashahhud and As-Salatul Ibraheemiyyah Know the vocabulary terms: Qiyam, Juloos, Rukoo', Tasleem, Sujood, Rak'ah, Qiblah, Fard, Tashahhud, Hasanat 		

Chapter 4.5:	Practicing	Praver
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 Demonstrate to your teacher how to make salat. The students will be taken to the gym by volunteers and will be instructed on how to make salat

This unit teaches the student important manners that all Muslims should posses.

Chapter 1: All Loves Kindness	 Know the importance of being kind to all creation. Define how Allah (swt) is Al-Lateef (the Kind) and memorize the name of Allah. Understand the hadeeth that Allah ordered that we be gentle with everything. Understand the hadeeth that Allah is gentle and he loves kindness in every matter. 		
Chapter 2: Ithaar and Caring	 Know the importance of sharing and become inspired to share. Define Al-Kawthar, and know its importance. Understand Ithaar and become inspired to practice it. 		
Chapter 3: I Obey My Parents	 Learn the meaning of Birrul Walidayn Be inspired to obey your parents and be kind to them. Understand the hadeeth about the importance of treating your mother and father the best. 		
Chapter 4: I Am A Muslim, I Must Be Clean	 Define and give an example of Taharah. Define and give an example Najasah. Learn that a Muslim should take a shower, wear clean and neat outfits when going to observe Al-Jumu'ah prayer. Be inspired to keep clean and in a state of Taharah. Be inspired to avoid najasah all the time. Know the vocabulary terms: Tahara, Najasah, Al-Jumu'ah. 		
Chapter 5: A Dinner In Our Neighbor's Home	 Know the importance of maintaining good etiquette when going to someone's house. Learn the du'aa's of going outside, riding a car or other means of transportation and entering the house. Learn the du'aa' of starting to eat and finishing eating. Be inspired to practice the Islamic etiquette of visiting others and eating with them. Know the vocabulary words: yameen and shimal. 		
Chapter 6: Leena and Zaid Sleep Over At Their Grandparents' House	 Know the etiquette of going to sleep. Know Al-Mu'awwithaat. Know the du'aa' of going to bed.
