- Unit C: Al-Qur'an-ul-Kareem: The Last Holy Book
 - Chapter 1: Al-Qur'an-ul-Kareem: The Last Holy Book (8 Exam Questions)
 - Learn how the Our'an was revealed.
 - Know that the Prophet, peace and blessings be upon him, was 40 years old when the Qur'an began to be revealed to him, and was 63 years old when the revelation was completed.
 - Learn the names of other books that Allah, the Most Glorified, sent to other prophets.
 - Learn the main elements of Al-Qur'an's message.
 - Be able to provide 3 main topics the Quran talks about as listed in this chapter.
 - Explain the relationship between Al-Qur'an and the Sunnah.
 - Understand that the Sunnah relates to the Quran in that it explains the meaning of Al-Qur'an and details some of its guidance. It also describes how to implement it into real life.
 - Know the vocabulary terms: Al-Qur'an, Al-Wahy, Surah, Suwar, Sunnah
 - Know the primary difference between Al-Qur'an and The Sunnah.
 - Know that the primary difference between the Quran and the Sunnah is that the Quran is the literal word of Allah, whereas the Sunnah was inspired by Allah, but the wording and actions are the Prohpet's.
 - Chapter 2: Short History of Al-Qur'an (10 Exam Questions)
 - Learn the facts of when and why the Qur'an was revealed.
 - Know that the revelation of the Quran started in the month of Ramadan during the year 610 A.D.
 - Know that the Prophet was in a cave called Hiraa' when the Quran was first revealed to him.
 - Learn how Al-Qur'an was recorded and preserved.
 - Be able to describe Khaleefah Uthman's contribution to the preservation of Al-Quran.
 - Examine various translations of the meaning of Al-Qur'an.
 - Understand that translations are not considered to be versions of the Quran but rather the meaning of the Quran as understood by the translator.
 - Know the names of some of the Scribes of Revelation.
 - Be able to name at least one of the Kuttab-ul-Wahy.
 - Learn about Sahabi Zaid Ibn Thabit and his efforts to serve Al-Qur'an.
 - Know the following vocabulary terms: Kuttab-ul-Wahy, Al-Mushaf Al-Uthmani, Suwar Makkiyyah, Suwar Madaniyyah
 - Know how the Prophet, peace and blessings be upon him, taught his companions the Ouran.
 - Know that Abdullah Ibn Mas'ood said that the Prophet used to teach them the Quran 10 ayaat or so every time, then they would memorize them, learn them, and apply them in their daily life before he would teach them more ayaats.
 - Chapter 3: Suwar and Ayaat (3 Exam Questions)
 - Understand the structure of Al-Qur'an and how it is organized.
 - Learn and understand the hadeeth of the Prophet, peace and blessings be upon him, where he instructed Muslims to complete the reading of the whole Qur'an monthly.
 - The Prophet, peace and blessings be upon him, advised us to complete the reading of the Quran, in one month but not in less than 7 days.
 - Chapter 4: You Love It; Then Respect It! (2 Exam Questions)
 - Learn how we should respect Al-Qur'an.
 - Understand the hadeeth of the Prophet, peace and blessings be upon him, where he states that the one who reads the Qur'an with difficulty will receive twice the reward of the person who says it easily and correctly.
 - Chapter 5: Mission POSSIBLE: Becoming a Hafith (2 Exam Questions)
 - Learn and understand the skills that help us memorize Al-Qur'an.
 - Understand the hadeeth of this chapter where the Prophet, peace and blessings be upon him, mentions the reward of one who learns and memorizes Al-Qur'an.
 - Know that the Prophet, peace and blessings be upon him said, whoever learns and

memorizes the Quran, Allah will grant him Jannah and enable him to intercede for ten of his relatives who will be condemned to the Hell-fire on the Day of Judgment
