The exam will consist of a mixture of multiple choice, true and false, and short answer questions. Ask Allah, the Most High, to help you do well on the exam and follow it up by studying.

 - Chapter 1: Tawheed: The Faith of All Prophets (14 Exam Questions)
 - Define Tawheed, Kufr, and Shirk.
 - Define the three parts of Tawheed.
 - Describe Tawheed-ul-Khaliq.
 - Know the 3 parts of tawheed of Al-Khaliq: belief that Allah is the only creator of the world, that he alone provides care to all his creations and that he alone controls the universe and allows things to happen.
 - Describe Tawheed-ul-Ibadah.
 - Describe Tawheed-ul-Asmaa.
 - Understand that although human beings and Allah may share attributes, Allah's attributes are still unique because Allah's attributes are complete and perfect while the attributes of creation is deficient. For example, Allah is powerful, but there are creations who are also powerful. The difference is that Allah's power is absolute and complete. There is never a period where Allah is weak. Human beings on the other hand are not even close to Allah's power nor are they powerful all the time. Think of a powerful person when they become old, are they still powerful?!
 - Understand the hadeeth about the few words that the Prophet, peace and blessings be upon him, taught Abdullah Ibn Abbas.
 - Understand thoroughly what the Prophet, peace and blessings be upon him, taught Abdullah Ibn Abbas in the hadeeth mentioned at the end of the chapter.
 - Learn the noble hadeeth of the Prophet, peace and blessings be upon him, that instructs the believer to seek aid help from Allah.
 - Learn the benefits of Tawheed.
 - Chapter 2: Ninety Nine Names, One Creator Part 1 (8 Exam Questions)
 - Understand that Allah has more than 99 names.
 - Describe what we should learn from the names of Allah.
 - Define some of the names of Allah.
 - Explain how Allah's hearing is not like our hearing.
 - Understand the meaning of Allah's name, Al-Haleem, The Tolerant.
 - Understand that Allah's names describe his attributes.
 - Chapter 3: Ninety Nine Names, One Creator Part 2 (3 Exam Questions)
 - Define the names of Allah that only Allah can hold.
